

Secondary school students raise RM55,000 for charity

KUCHING: Students from Lodge National Secondary School have raised over RM55,000 this year for various charitable organisations in Sarawak.

The funds were mostly raised from the "A Day of Love" project by Form Four students as part of the practical component of the Moral Education subject.

Student groups which took part in the fundraising drive included the Career Club, Leo Club, Interact Club, Prefectorial Board, Form 5A Economics Class and the Science Department.

"It has always been our school's tradition to give back to society. We not only emphasise academic performance but also character-building.

"Raising funds for charity is part of that," Lodge Group of Schools director Thomas Huo said at a Jom Charity event organised by the school to hand over the funds to 15 charities here.

He added that the students' collective effort to raise a large amount for charity showed their awareness of the needs of the community.
